## Intervest significantly contributes to the 'Green Singel' with green façade containing 50.000 live plants

The eye-catcher is the green façade, and with 50.000 living plants it has one of the largest such façades on any office building in Belgium. This initiative perfectly fits into the City of Antwerp's Green Singel project.




▲ Greenhouse Antwerp, green façade containing 50.000 live plants

The green façade helps reduce the amount of substances that cause air pollution, for example fine particulate matter and carbon dioxide. In addition to this, the vegetation reduces wind speeds along the façades. Research has moreover shown that green walls have a positive impact on the insulation performance of buildings. Finally, on top of the benefits relating to insulation, the combination of substrate, plants and air trapped in the green façade system provides good sound proofing.


Intervest is a regulated real estate company active in the offices market and the logistics market. Its growth strategy is based on both a reshuffling of the offices
